A 100% refund will be made if we receive written notification two weeks prior to the start of the term. A 50% charge will be incurred if a student drops AfterCare (ClubHouse) enrollment within the first two weeks of the term. There are no refunds for Enrichment classes. 

ENRICHMENT WINTER TERM 2018 CLASSES

Enrichment classes are offered each day in addition to ClubHouse (AfterCare) for Preschool – Grade 5. Many Enrichment classes are taught by expert instructors who are partnering with D-E 360° and represent various, external arts, cultural, and/or sports organizations, while other Enrichment classes are led by a variety of energetic D-E faculty/staff members. ENRICHMENT CLASS ENROLLMENT/REGISTRATION & FEES:

- All Enrichment classes have a minimum and maximum enrollment. Classes are enrolled on a first-come, first-served basis. Enroll early so that your child gets his/her first choice. If minimum enrollment is not met, the Enrichment class will be closed and you will be refunded.
- Enrichment class fees range from \$450 \$550 per child, per class, as noted here.
- The Enrichment class fee includes AfterCare(ClubHouse) activities for your child(ren) during the day(s) of the Enrichment class only.

ENRICHMENT CLASS DESCRIPTIONS:

→ ANIMAL TALES

\$450 (GRADE 1-3)

Tenafly Nature Center's educators will introduce students to some amazing animals each week at our Lower School! Join us as we explore amazing amphibians, mighty mammals, and reptile relatives.

→CHESS

\$550 (GRADE K-5)

NYChess is one of the largest youth chess programs in the tri-state region. Their mission is to spread the love of the game as well as develop a child's mind with advanced logistical gaming skills. Come explore the foundations of chess strategy.

→CODING

\$500 INCLUDING \$50 MATERIAL FEE (GRADE 3-5)

Children will learn how to code to create games, stories and animations using Scratch and other programming Apps for the iPad. This class will be fun, engaging, and interactive as students learn basic programming language and develop a foundation for technological explorations.

→ FANTASY SPORTS & WIFFLE BALL \$450 (GRADE 4-5)

Students will learn how to manage their own fantasy teams and how to follow and understand statistical categories in sports like basketball, football, baseball, or hockey. After 30 minutes of iPad screen time, students will head up to the gym to apply their learning while playing real sports, like whiffle ball and touch football.

→ FENCING

\$550 (GRADE 2-5)

We've partnered with Patrick Durkan, co-founder/director of the Durkan Fencing Academy, which was developed by Olympic Fencing Coaches and exercise physiologists, to provide the most safe and effective fencing training. For beginners, these group classes will introduce students to the basics of sabre, epee and foil. For experienced fencers, the Academy is designed to develop your individual fencing skills.

→ FUNDAMENTAL STICK SPORTS \$450 (GRADE 1-3)

Varsity Coach Kim Franco will have the students loving hockey & lacrosse! Students will learn the fundamentals of hockey playing lead-up/modified hockey games while learning multiple styles of passes and positions, and ultimately have a blast with the game of hockey!

→ GAME ON!

\$450 (GRADE 1-3)

If you love to play games, then Game On is for you. We focus on team-oriented games including Kickball, Whiffle Ball, Pin Bombardment, Coconuts, and Newcomb to name a few. Variety is the spice of life at Game On!. Our emphasis is on sportsmanship and team fun.

→ROBOTICS

\$500 INCLUDING \$50 MATERIAL FEE (GRADE 1-5)

Students learn basic engineering and programming concepts, starting with prescribed projects that allow them to build and program robots. After their first projects students are then encouraged to experiment with creating their own robotic designs, and how to program them

to move, respond to sensors, and interact with their surroundings.

→RUNNING CLUB \$450 (GRADE 3-5)

Running Club is a fun way to make new friends, set attainable goals, build stamina and endurance, and be a supportive team member, while exploring the beautiful Dwight-Englewood campus. Children set personal and team goals daily, monitor their progress and feel a sense of pride as they achieve those goals. Some children aim to complete a 5K!

→ SEWING & NEEDLEWORK \$450 (GRADE 2-5)

Learn the basics of hand sewing, and begin a project that can include: quilting, button-mania, embroidery or crocheting. No experience necessary.

→STICK STARS \$450 (GRADE 3-5)

This program builds and expands upon the fundamentals learned in PE class. Unlike PE, students will be learning in a semi-competitive environment as they refine; stick handling, passing, and shooting with Varsity Coach Kim Franco.

→TENNIS

\$550 (PRESCHOOL 3-GRADE 3)

In partnership with Tsolak Gevorkian and his coaching team, D-E 360° is introducing a Tennis Academy to the ACE 2017-2018 offerings. Beginners will enjoy the basic activities and games designed to facilitate the movement and positioning tennis requires. Intermediate will focus on stroke and more advanced skill development.

→ THE ADVENTURERS \$450 (GRADE 4-5)

Come out, get some exercise, use your brain to solve problems, and discover your inner strength! Students will use the full range of their physical, emotional and cognitive skills. The non-traditional athlete can excel and the athletically gifted will be challenged in new and exciting ways.
