



India: Service-Learning and Guided Historical Tours Summer 2018 June 23-July 2, 2018

Immerse yourself in India, a country rich with history and remarkable for its diversity of religions and communities. During this 10-day trip to India, students will get a glimpse of India—from renowned historical sites to service learning in a village school to visits to the largest slum in India. It will be an experience that provides both exposure to the culture of India as well as a window into how the lower socio-economic strata of the Indian population live. Participants will be travelers, not tourists, in environments far different from home.

- The trip will begin with a guided historical tour of the Taj Mahal, one of the seven wonders of the world.
- Next there will be a guided historical tour of the south Indian city of Hyderabad, a 425 year old city that blends Muslim and Hindu cultures.
- Students will receive an on-site orientation from experts in rural development and then will spend 3 days engaged in a service-learning project at a primary school for low-income children. The rural stay will include village and farm visits as well as a visit to a microfinance company.
- The trip will end with a visit to the city of Mumbai, where there will be a guided tour of Dharavi, one of the largest urban slums in the world.
