# **ENRICHMENT SPRING TERM 2018 CLASSES**

Enrichment classes are offered each day in addition to ClubHouse (AfterCare) for Preschool – Grade 5. Many Enrichment classes are taught by expert instructors who are partnering with D-E 360° and represent various, external arts, cultural, and/or sports organizations, while other Enrichment classes are led by a variety of energetic D-E faculty/staff members. # ENRICHMENT CLASS ENROLLMENT/REGISTRATION & FEES:

- Spring 2018 Term begins Monday, April 2, 2018 and is in session through Friday, June 7, 2018.
- All Enrichment classes have a minimum and maximum enrollment. Classes are enrolled on a first-come, first-served basis. Enroll early so that your child gets his/her first choice. If minimum enrollment is not met, the Enrichment class will be closed and you will be refunded.
- Enrichment class fees range from \$450 \$550 per child, per class, as noted here.
- The Enrichment class fee includes AfterCare(ClubHouse) activities for your child(ren) during the day(s) of the Enrichment class only.

# ENRICHMENT CLASS DESCRIPTIONS: →ADVANCED ART

#### \$450 + \$50 MATERIALS FEE (GRADES 3-5)

Melissa DeJesus welcomes students who are serious about art to learn the foundations of visual thinking and drawing techniques, as well as watercolors and ink.

### →CARTOONING 101

### \$450+ \$50 MATERIALS (GRADES 1-4)

Students will learn how the simplistic form of cartooning exaggerates real life. Led by Melissa Delesus, anatomy, expressions, and gestures will be explored and developed to bring characters to life. Manga and Kawaii also will be explored. → CHESS CLUB

# \$550 (GRADES K-5)

Chess is offered at two developmentally appropriate levels in a double classroom. Our younger students are in one classroom with Katia while more sophisticated students study and play directly with Chess Master Saudin. Both come from the highly regarded NYChessKids program. Players will be invited to play interschool tournaments in Manhattan.

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# \$500 + \$50 MATERIALS FEE (GRADES 3-5)

Code-makers will create games, stories, and animations using Scratch and other programming apps for the iPad. Taught by Chris Fleischl, students learn basic programming language and develop a foundation for tech exploration.

# →FENCING

### \$550 (GRADE 2-5)

Sabre, epee, and foil are all explored in this program developed and coached by Durkan Fencing Academy, Home of Division 1 Men's Foil National Championship Team. New students will receive a solid introduction to Fencing. Returning students will continue to refine their skills.

### →FLAG FOOTBALL \$450 (GRADES 2-5)

James Byrne is back to teach the basics of Flag Football and get students running, catching and throwing the pigskin. The emphasis of this class is to get a good game up and running for the full hour. No prior experience is necessary.

# →GRAPHIC NOVELS

# \$450 + \$50 MATERIALS FEE (GRADES 3-5)

Led by accomplished artist and graphic novelist, Melissa DeJesus, students will learn how to tell a story in the form of a graphic novel and create their own mini comic.

### →iPIGGiBANK

# \$550 (GRADES 1-5)

iPiggiBank Money Management for Kids is a handson financial literacy program to start students on the path to lifelong healthy financial habits. They will learn to save, earn, share, budget and shop wisely through multi-sensory learning modalities. →KIDZ THEATRE

# \$550 (SECTION 1: GRADES 1-2 /SECTION 2: GRADES 3-5)

Drama comes alive through theatre-games, role playing, Young actors will learn to use facial expressions, voice and body movement to act.

### → NATURALISTS & ANIMALS \$450 (GRADE 2-5)

Environmental Educators from Tenafly Nature Center will share their knowledge about the natural world through; animal ambassador visits, seasonal observations, artifacts, and a journey through life cycles, habitats, and adaptations.

### →PRETEAM SPORTS & CARDIO \$450 (GRADES K-2)

Varsity Coach Kim Franco will introduce seasonal sport skills such as; baseball basics (catching, throwing, batting, base running), team kickball, track races (starts, handoffs) and field games. Each class will have a very active cardio play component.

### \$550 + \$50 MATERIALS FEE (GRADES 1-5)

Doctora Collado and Chris Fleischl teach students to apply basic engineering and programming skills by designing, building, and operating robots. Students will move at a pace appropriate to their level.

# →STICK SPORTS

### \$450 + \$25 MATERIALS FEE (GRADES K-2)

Varsity Coach Kim Franco continues to build a team of players who know how to handle sticks, understand positions, and play as a team. Hockey, field hockey and lacrosse will be introduced. Personal safety equipment (e.g. googles, shin quard) are provided.

#### →T2S BASKETBALL \$550 (GRADES 3-5)

"T2S" stands for "Train to Succeed." According to coaches Larry Umana and Nathan Lopez, T2S Basketball Academy was created with a goal to provide a performance-based and skills development training program to help athletes excel in all aspects in the game.

### →TENNIS

# \$550 (SECTION 1: PREK-K / SECTION 2: GRADES 1-3)

Offered in two developmental sections: PreK & K, and Grades 1-3, Tsolak Gevorkian teaches basic activities and games designed to facilitate movement and positioning. More advanced players focus on stroke and skill development.

#### →VISIONS OF AMERICA \$450 (GRADES K-2)

Ms. Madison covers American history with age appropriate materials and discussions on topics such as Declaration of Independence, History of the Statue of Liberty, Citizenship, Ellis Island, Famous American men and women: Susan B. Anthony, Rosa Parks, The US Presidents, Branches of Government, The Pledge of Allegiance.
