## Trip Itinerary Highlights include:

- Exploring Sarajevo, the capital of Bosnia and Herzegovina, culturally diverse towns, where East meets West and the major religions of the world are represented.
- Visiting the bazaars of Baščaršija to sample dishes influenced by the Ottoman empire and shopping for souvenirs in its cobblestone alleys.
- Getting to know Mostar, and sites that bear witness to the history of the Balkans. Mostar is a beautiful city with bridges and valleys. Learn about traditional life from local performers, participate in a coffee workshop, and hear local staff's personal histories.
- Touring the medieval town of Pocitel, Doviđenja and Zbogom.
- Traveling to Split to experience history firsthand through the ages including influences of the Romans, Venetians, Austrians, and Communist that once ruled this small coastal town.

- Hiking to the top of the Marjan Hill and sample the food of the Dalmatian coast and enjoy an evening visit to Diocletian's Palace.
- Supporting the local community through community service initiatives: Partner with a local grassroots NGO who help support local schools. Work alongside local students and get your hands dirty as you work on sustainable community service projects to build infrastructure and promote peace in the region.
- Participating in Rustic Ties, a unique and powerful activity that allows students to capture the memories and learning moments of their program to process and share with their communities back home.

## Total trip costs \$5,550
